# Attendance Policy

- BE HERE EVERY DAY!
- Consistent attendance correlates with SUCCESS!
- Each block = 2 periods. If you miss a block, you are missing 2 days worth of instruction.
- 5 consecutive absences require a note from a medical office.
- A students accumulating five (5) or more unexcused absences for a semester course or ten (10) unexcused absences for an annual course will be subject to the withholding of final passing grades and must resolve the absences.



# Attendance and Tardies

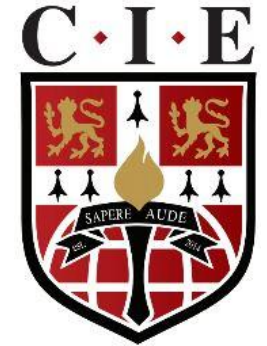

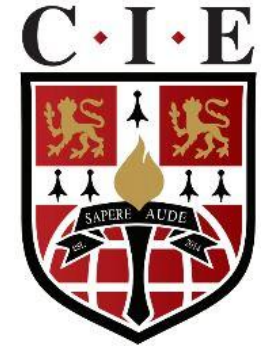

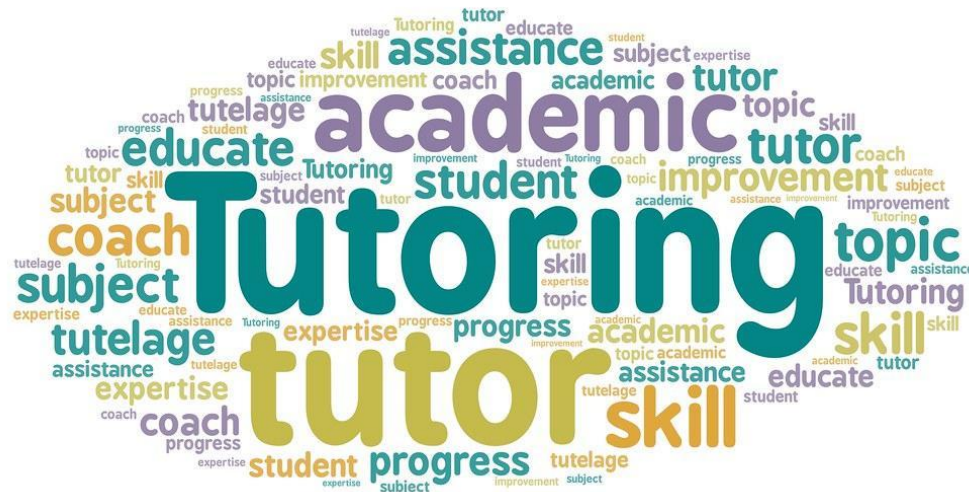


# Tutoring

- 100 COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS

## Current State Testing Requirements for Graduation

- Pass FAST ELA 10<sup>th</sup> grade
- Pass Algebra 1 EOC or concordant
- Take Geometry EOC, Biology EOC, US History EOC





# Graduation Requirements **NOT** Needed for **Cambridge Students**

- **Personal Fitness - 1/2 credit**
- **P/E Credit (Team Sports, Weight Training, Fitness Lifestyle) - 1/2 Credit**
- **Fine/ Performing Arts, Speech and Debate, Practical Arts - 1 Credit**
- **If at any time, a CIE student/students transfers into another school that is not a Cambridge School or Cambridge Program, those students are responsible for making up the above credits in order to graduate with a high school diploma from the State of Florida.**

# community Service

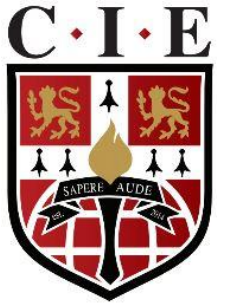


- Community service is an MDCPS graduation requirement.
