Attendance Policy

- → BE HERE EVERY DAY!

- → Each block = 2 periods. If you miss a block, you are missing 2 days worth of instruction.

Cambridge transcripts must be requested separately from high school transcripts. Cambridge transcript requests are found on the school website - ciecambridge.net



 Government agency, School, Hospital, a retirement organization, or for an elderly or disabled individual in need of assistance.






