UNIFORM POLICY

- OXFORD SHIRTS WITH LONG OR SHORT SLEEVES IN WHITE

- BLACK PANTS WORN AT THE WAIST. NO LEGGINGS, NO SWEATPANTS, NO JOGGERS. NO RIPPED JEANS.

ATTENDANCE POLICY



- STUDENT CLASS ATTENDANCE AND ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE ARE MUTUALLY INTEGRATED.
- STUDENTS WHO ARE ABSENT MUST BRING A NOTE TO MS. BLEDSOE (MAIN OFFICE) WITHIN 72
 HOURS OF THE ABSENCE.
- THE NOTE SHOULD INCLUDE THE STUDENTS' NAME, STUDENT ID#, THE DATE(S) OF THE ABSENCE, THE REASON FOR THE ABSENCE AND A PARENT SIGNATURE.
- AFTER THREE (3) OR MORE CONSECUTIVE ABSENCES WITHIN THE SCHOOL YEAR, EACH STUDENT WILL BE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE A WRITTEN STATEMENT FROM A HEALTH CARE PROVIDER. DOCUMENTATION MUST INCLUDE ALL DAYS THE STUDENT HAS BEEN ABSENT FROM SCHOOL.
- A STUDENTS ACCUMULATING FIVE (5) OR MORE UNEXCUSED ABSENCES FOR A SEMESTER COURSE
 OR TEN (10) UNEXCUSED ABSENCES FOR AN ANNUAL COURSE WILL BE SUBJECT TO THE
 WITHHOLDING OF FINAL PASSING GRADES AND MUST RESOLVE THE ABSENCES.

EXCUSED ABSENCES

- STUDENT ILLNESS
- MEDICAL APPOINTMENT
- RELIGIOUS HOLIDAY
- DEATH IN THE FAMILY
- SCHOOL SPONSORED EVENT
- SUBPOENA OR MANDATORY COURT APPEARANCE
- OUTDOOR SUSPENSION
- OTHER INDIVIDUAL ABSENCES BEYOND THE CONTROL OF THE PARENT AS APPROVED BY THE PRINCIPAL

- STUDENTS OR PARENTS MAY REQUEST HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENTS THROUGH THE ATTENDANCE OFFICE FOR EXCUSED ABSENCES (3 OR MORE DAYS).
- •IF A STUDENT MISSES ONE DAY OF SCHOOL, THEY ARE **EXPECTED** TO TAKE TESTS AND/OR TURN IN ANY ASSIGNMENTS ON THE DAY THEY RETURN TO SCHOOL WITH AN EXCUSE NOTE.
- •THE STUDENT IS RESPONSIBLE TO PRESENT THE EXCUSED NOTE FROM THE OFFICE TO THEIR TEACHERS AND ASK FOR MISSED ASSIGNMENTS.
- •IF A STUDENT IS ABSENT FROM A DOUBLE BLOCKED PERIOD, THEY WILL MISS TWO DAYS WORTH OF LESSONS.
- •A PARENT MUST ESCORT HIS/HER CHILD INTO THE BUILDING TO SCHOOL WHEN TARDY.
- •CIE HAS A CLOSED CAMPUS POLICY. STUDENTS MUST STAY ON SCHOOL GROUNDS FROM THE TIME THEY ARRIVE UNTIL DISMISSAL.




