Attendance


- After five (5) or more consecutive absences within the school year, each student will be required to provide a written statement from a health care provider. Documentation must include all days the student has been absent from school.
- ▶ A students accumulating five (5) or more unexcused absences for a semester course or ten (10) unexcused absences for an annual course will be subject to the withholding of final passing grades and must resolve the absences.





- If a student misses one day of school, he/she would be expected to take tests and/or turn in any assignments on the day he/she returns to school with an excuse note.
- The student is responsible to present the excused note from the office to his/her teachers and ask for missed assignments. If a student is absent from a double blocked period, this will constitute two (2) absences from that class.
- A parent must escort his/her child into the building to school when tardy. CIE has a closed campus policy. Students must stay on school grounds from the time they arrive until dismissal.
- Students will be dismissed early through the attendance office. Any individual signing out a student must be on the Emergency Contact Card and present a valid picture identification. No early dismissals after 1:50 PM or 11:50 on early release days





- ▶ Wear your own ID at ALL times
- ▶ Uniforms are worn EVERYDAY! Red, Black, White Cambridge Tops or White Oxford Tops with logo. Black Pants only.
- No Short skirts above the thighs (must be knee length); Leggings, jeggings or sweat pants <u>ARE NOT PERMITTED!</u>

FAFSA - Free Application for Federal Student Aid

Application opens October 1st

First come first serve basis

What you will need:

- Your SSN
- Your Parents Income tax information for 2021
- What schools you want to send your application to.

FAQ's:

- 1. Do we still need to apply even if we know we don't qualify?
 - a. Yes, every student should apply. Many Universities and scholarships require the FAFSA application to be completed in order to distribute any award money.
- 2. Which parents information do I use?
 - a. FAFSA has changed their rule instead of having to use the custodial parent or the parent the student lives with you can use the information for parent who provides the most financial support can be used.
- 3. What application year of FAFSA do I complete?
 - a. You will need to complete the 2023-2024 application.

Dual Enrollment

- Dual Enrollment is a way for student to take MDC courses while continuing their high school diploma at CIE. Dual enrollment student continue to attend CIE full time.
- You must have a 3.0 GPA or better to participate in dual enrollment
- Your MDC grades will affect your High School GPA
- If your GPA for MDC falls below a 2.0, you cannot take anymore dual enrollment classes.
- If you CIE GPA drops below a 3.0, you cannot take anymore dual enrollment classes.

To start Dual Enrollment

- you must first apply for Dual Enrollment through MDC
- Complete the google form on the CIE counselor's corner using your MDC ID number
- Take the ACCUPLACER exam.
- Log into the MDC dual enrollment portal and add your classes.
- Send your Cambridge transcript to MDC

Continuing Dual Enrollment

- It is the students responsibility to keep up with dual enrollment and MDC classes. They will be considered a college student while taking MDC courses.
- Student need to be self sufficient and responsible.
- Students must manage and track their courses and requirements.

Community Service Hours

All students must complete a minimum of 100 community service hours for graduation, college entrance, and scholarship considerations. Community Service Projects must be done at a NON-PROFIT, 501-C ORGANIZATION.

<u>COMPLETE A MINIMUM OF 100 HOURS</u> – Can be from same organization or several organizations – should be a community service PROJECT.

- Request and receive a letter from each organization where you completed your hours.

- Grades: GPA: Can you cut it at my college?
- Test Scores: SAT/ACT: What is your record for achievement?
- Activities, Honors, Leadership: What will you bring to my college?
- Your College Essays (if required): What will you actually be like at my college?
- Recommendations: Are they an accurate reflection of you?
